Hello KMS community

With the first week of school behind us, we want to thank our teachers for welcoming students back to school and getting the year rolling. Thank you families for getting students to school on time and ready for learning.

Korematsu welcomed 710 students this year. We have increased our enrollment! This is a great problem to have, but we will need to add class sections in the coming days to accommodate these numbers. Our new 7th grade class is comprised of 374 students! This is way over the initial projections we received in Spring. Adding sections does mean we will need to change a number of student schedules. We will send a community update before these changes are made.

Families, we ask that parents not walk onto campus. Please remember to drop your student in the designated areas and follow our clockwise traffic pattern. Because we are located in a residential community pick-up and drop-off is extremely congested. I encourage you to drop students on Norvell or Lawrence streets and **avoid Donal Ave. as much as possible**. Last year we saw a lot of unsafe driving and do not want a repeat of these traffic conditions. Always drive in the clockwise pattern and never drop a student off and have them move across the street in traffic to get to campus. Please let them out and then move on to make room for the next car. And please do not park in front of our neighbor's driveways.

Students will begin taking the iReady diagnostic assessments this week for Reading and Math. These assessments provide teachers with critical data when planning standards based lessons.

Hopefully everyone is getting back into the swing of things for the 2024-2025 school year.

Class Schedules and Schedule Changes

Korematsu is currently showing more than 65 students over our initial projections. There is a high likelihood that classes will shift over the next few days/weeks.

KMS Basic Protocols

Cell Phones

KMS does not allow cell phones to be used on campus. School is a place for learning and <u>cell phones continue to be a</u> <u>distraction from learning.</u> Please remind your student that cell phones are for emergency purposes. We need your support to keep the focus on learning please do not call or text your student while they are on campus. Please call the main office. We can pull your student from class to call you back.

Our policy is simple:

- Cell Phones seen on campus will be confiscated.
- The First and Second time a cell phone is confiscated students can pick it up from the office.
- The Third time a cell phone is confiscated parents will need to pick up the phone from the office.

RE: COVID

Per CDPH, former covid guidelines no longer apply. The following guidelines is what CDC recommends for students reporting covid illness covid-positive tests:

- 1) If the students themselves test positive or have symptoms, it should be treated as any other illness. Covid-related absences will be coded "I" in PowerSchool.
- 2) Isolation periods are no longer required; students may return to school as soon as they no longer show symptoms or have had a fever. If symptoms are present, student should stay home until symptoms are gone. Ind. Study may be offered.
- 3) Masking is recommended for 5 days after the reported covid illness
- 4) Students may return to class when they no longer show symptoms or have had a fever within the last 24 hours (without use of medication)
- 5) If household members report positive covid test or symptoms, the student is allowed in school as long the student is not positive or with symptoms.

Please review your students social media accounts and pages. Instagram pages are often used to spread misinformation, harassment and bullying of students at KMS and other schools. In all my years of flagging these accounts to Instagram, I have yet to see a single page taken down. Students are creating pages using multiple accounts and shared passwords. Sometimes several students are in "control" of a page. Often the language and images/videos of these pages are innocent and fun, but there are also instances where the page and posts are intentional harassment of classmates. As we have seen, this harassment can be extremely harmful. Please speak with your student about their use of instagram and social media.
